Director's foreword


Firstly, thank you for coming along to this performance of My Fair Lady. I am sure that you are in for a treat with such a talented cast of performers and musicians.

My Fair Lady is such a classic show; being familiar to many generations, I was very aware that making any major changes may change the dynamic and familiarity of the show. I thought it should be important to acknowledge any changes that may come across as dated or deemed not acceptable by modern standards, showing an awareness of change but without impinging too much on the narrative.

I conducted a fair amount of research leading up to the cast coming together for the first time and was drawn to the background and the progression of the story of My Fair Lady. The musical was adapted from George Bernard Shaw's Pygmalion which had been inspired by the myth within Metamorphoses by the Ancient Greek poet Ovid. Shaw's Pygmalion has had multiple endings, where Eliza and Higgins part ways, with and without Freddy being Eliza's ending. Whereas the musical brings them together, but leaves plenty of room for interpretation. Ovid's Pygmalion is a sculptor who is trying to create the statue of a perfect woman which then comes to life as a real person. Pygmalion realises, once the sculpture is living and has her own mind, that the control he once had has now been lost. Therefore I really wanted to reflect this turmoil in the progression of Higgins's character. I added the statues in Higgins's office as a nod to the Greek roots of the storyline, but also as a method to acknowledge moments that the company felt could be addressed or emphasised.

I would like to thank the production, technical and backstage team, who have been an excellent support in pulling this show together, and to the cast for really helping me bring this out of my imagination and onto the stage.

I very much hope you enjoy the show!

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Show Synopsis

Hailed by critics and audiences for its heart and its wit, My Fair Lady is a beautiful musical about transformation, patronage, gender politics and class, based on George Bernard Shaw's play, Pygmalion. Acclaimed Professor and confirmed bachelor Henry Higgins makes a wager with his linguistic colleague Colonel Pickering that in six months he can pass off "gutter snipe" Eliza Doolittle as a duchess at an embassy ball. Through arduous training, day and night, Eliza learns how to speak English "properly," and transforms into a lady respected and adored by all classes. Along the way she bewitches young Freddy Eynsford-Hill into falling in love with her, and convinces a supposed linguistics expert that she is royalty. Through her transformation process, Eliza forges a deep connection with Colonel Pickering and most especially with Professor Higgins. However, she finds herself in a difficult position, now too refined to go back to her old life and not with any means or desire to live life as a lady of leisure - especially by herself. When Higgins completely fails to acknowledge Eliza's role in her own transformation, she leaves his home. It is only then that Higgins realizes that he cares deeply for Eliza. The musical ends with Eliza's return to Higgins's home, and the ending is left ambiguous, yet it is beloved for being both one of the cleverest and one of the most romantic shows of all time.

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




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
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
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
